

# Prep Thinclads Set Two Records

## Saginaw Arthur Hill Adds Track Championship to Basketball Title in State Meet Here; Fowlerville in C

Saginaw Arthur Hill, winner of the top state basketball title this year, today captured the Class A championship of the lower peninsula track and field meet resumed at Michigan State college after a war-caused lapse of one year.

Two meet records were shattered as more than 600 youthful athletes competed for titles in four classes. East Grand Rapids emerged as the winner in a hot scrap for the Class B title, while Fowlerville triumphed in Class C and Leelanau for boys took the Class D crown. None of the returning 1942 title winners came close to retaining championships.

Just as he almost single-handedly gave his school the cage crown, Duke Edlund was the 600 nose today as Arthur Hill outclassed a 22-team field with 28 points. Edlund won the shot put, tied for first in the high jump, was second in the high hurdles, and placed fifth in the low hurdles to collect 17½ points.

**New Hurdle Mark**

At that he was runner-up in individual scoring to Garion Campbell, brilliant Negro athlete, who accounted for all of Monroe's 19 points with a record-breaking performance in the 200-yard low hurdles, a first in the high hurdles, second in the broad jump and fifth in the high jump.

Class A runner-up was Dearborn Junction, which collected 282½ points to edge out Grand Rapids Catholic, third with 235.6, and Grand Rapids South, fourth with 221. The runner-up spot was settled as Furdson took third in the closing 800 relay.

The only Class A record to tumble was in the low hurdles as Campbell streaked across in 23.8 seconds, clipping a tenth of a second from the meet standard of 23.9 established by Perry Mason of Monroe in 1927.

**Place in 8 of 12 Events**

Johnny Klever of Grant accounted for the other record as he topped the Class C mile in 4:37.4, bettering the state mark of 4:37.4 established in 1941 by Floyd of Furdson.

Arthur Hill placed in 8 of the 12 events, with Dean Outerhout adding a 100-yard victory to Ribbens' being first in the shot-put and his first place high jump outlook with three others, including teammate George Caborn; Hal Koppin added Arthur Hill's cause with a second in the mile, won by Dick Dembos of Kalamazoo Central.

Dembos' victory was the only first scored by the school that won the Class A title in 1942.

Bob Swain was the hero of a thrilling Class B conquest by East Grand Rapids. Swain, whose triumphs in the 100 and 220 dashes were the fastest performances of the day in those two events, anchored the Grand Rapids school's 800 relay to victory in the closing event, giving his squad a winning total of 231.5 points.

Niles was second less than a point behind with 224.65, while Ypsilanti Central was third with 221 and Leelanau Central was third with 221 in Class A.

Swain won the 100 in :10.3 and took the 220 in :22.3, in Class A.

the century went to Outerhout in 1:13, while Bud Eise of Grand Rapids Delta Tech won the 220 in :22.6.

Fowlerville, paced by Marvin Grosnick, won in the 100 and Duane Kingman's shot-put victory, seized the Class C title with 231.4 points. Second was St. Clair Shores with 28, while Cranbrook took third with 251.5.

**Relike Is Triple Winner**

Leelanau for Boys, a school with 23 boys entered, captured Bloomfield Hills in a wide-open battle for the Class D championship. Coppans, the closing 800 relay, Leelanau finished with 54 points, while Bloomfield Hills was second with 52½.

The only triple winner of the meet was Henry Relike of Boys Vocational school, who won the 100, 220 and shot-put in Class D for most of his school's 20 points, good for fourth place behind Boston Harbor, St. John's.

**Kalamazoo Central**, finishing seventh in Class A with 135.6 points, made the best showing of the three 1942 title winners on hand. Birmingham, Class B champion, placed 14th with 712.13 points, while Inlay City, Class C titleist was 21st with 311.18. Bear Lake did not defend its Class D title.
