

# Fenton, Grand Blanc and Kearsley Win Titles in County Track Meet

Fenton High School's team, led by Jack Stoddard, who captured both dashes, won the Class B championship in the Genesee County League's annual track and field meet at Grand Blanc Friday, with Kearsley running away with Class C honors in a three-team race. Girls' honors, meanwhile, went to Grand Blanc in Class B and Kearsley in Class C.

Stoddard did the dashes in 10.8 and 23.2, Jack Howe won the low hurdles, Ken Wegner copped one of the 880 races, Harold Murphy tied for first in the pole vault and the relay team finished first to lead Fenton to 66 points. Flushing scored 46½, Grand Blanc's defending champions got only 41½, and Clio had 26.

Denslee Qualls won the broad jump, 220-yard dash and placed second in the shot put to pace Kearsley to 100½ points. Goodrich scored 47 with Ace Langley contributing firsts in the 100 and shot put and a second in the 220. Leroy Boulton won the hurdles races and placed second in the broad jump to get most of Hoover's 24½ points:

Hyrtol DeMeritt was Flushing's main scorer as he won the first 440 race in 55.2, broad-jumped 20 feet 3 inches for five more points and competed on

the relay team, which placed second. The only other first for Flushing was Day's victory in the high hurdles. Bob Voltenburg of Grand Blanc won the second 440 race in 58 seconds, John Gundry gave the defending champs a first in part of the 880, Ray Hallmark tied for tops in the pole vault at 9 feet 9, and Bob Bare won the shot put for Grand Blanc's first places.

Clio gained one first, with Or-lis Clark legging the mile in 5.09.

Aside from Qualls' work for Kearsley, Bill Douglas won the mile, Bill Guilde took the 440, Dick Kardos the 880, and the Kearsley relay quartet sprinted home first. In addition, Douglas and Leo Paro of Kearsley tied McPhail and Sibilsky of Goodrich for first in the pole vault, while Powers tied McKenzie of Goodrich in the high jump.

In girls' competition, Grand Blanc had 40 points, Davison 33 and Flushing 25. Kearsley's Class C total was 52, Goodrich score 36 and Gaines 10.

Florence Draws led Grand Blanc to Class B victory with winning throws in the softball throws, 162 feet and 82 feet 3 inches, respectively. Donna MacGillivary gave the winners their other first by doing 7 feet 8 inches in the standing broad jump. The Everett twins of Flushing scored two firsts, Margaret taking the 50-yard dash in 6.6 and Sue winning the hop, step and jump. Vera Hershberger of Davison won the shot put with a toss of 31 feet 4 inches, and Flushing copped the relay.

Joyce Jenkins, freshman, led Kearsley with victories in the 50-yard dash at 6.5 seconds and in the standing broad jump with 8 feet 1. Betty Giertz took the shot and Doris McAllister the hop, step and jump for Kearsley, while Kearsley's relay team finished in a dead heat with Goodrich, Jenkins anchoring the quartet. Sue Sill won firsts in the baseball throw and basketball throw for Gaines, with heaves of 188 feet 10 inches, and 81 feet 3 inches.
