

Cooley Spurt Saves Title

Cardinal Trackmen Outdo Huskies, 72-56

Cooley High School runners paraded to their fourth straight West Side indoor track title in the City League by swamping the threatening Redford Huskies in the distance races.

The Cardinals all but monopolized the mile and the 880-yard runs in piling up 72 points to 56 for Redford.

Wally McGhee broke the tape for Cooley in the mile in 4:47.4, followed by Ross Smith in third place, Don Keeler in fourth and Bill Saunders in a tie for fifth. Archie Stewart was Redford's only point-winner, tying Saunders for fifth place.

IN THE 880, Dick Hoffman, of Western, was a surprise winner. He was timed in 2:08.8, but Cooley's Warren Neumann tied for second, Seymour Busky was fifth and Tony Badalco was sixth.

Even in the 220, in which Redford seemed to have all the cards, Cooley took the initiative. Ron Fedraw, the Cards' only 1944 veteran, won in :25.2 by nosing out Johnny Wilcox and Bill Fugenschuh, Redford sprinters who had consistently won their events during the dual meet season.

REDFORD WENT into the final day of the meet carrying a 7½-point lead, but the best the team could do Thursday was one second place, two thirds and two fifths.

Team scores: Cooley 72, Redford 56, Mackenzie 44, Northwestern 17½, Western 15½, Central 9, Southwestern 6.

The East Side championships will be concluded at Denby Friday at 3:30 p. m. Denby, the favorite, holds a big lead, having scored 27½ points to 11 for Southeastern, which is in second place.
