

Ann Arborite Stars But Saginaw Wins

Ann Arbor High school's Ted Judson was far and away the individual star of the meet but his efforts weren't enough and Saginaw High today holds the sixth River Rouge Invitational indoor track championship.

The meet, which attracted 507 athletes from 37 Michigan high schools, was run off in Yost Field House Saturday afternoon and night. Saginaw barely squeaked by the defending champion, Saginaw Arthur Hill, with 28 points to the latter team's 27. Ann Arbor High was third with 23 points, all contributed by three Pioneer runners.

Judson scored seconds in both hurdle events and in the high jump for 15 points and the gold shoe, emblematic of individual supremacy. Don Makielski added five Ann Arbor points as he placed second to Milan's Allen Hosler in the mile run while Don's twin, Ed, took fourth in the 880 for the other three counters.

Coaches decided prior to the meet that next year's running of the invitational will be on a school class basis with Class-A and Class-B schools running separately while Classes C and D compete together. Plans are also being made to speed up the finals program which dragged on for four hours Saturday night.
