

Second In Five-A Meeting

Scoring a mild upset, Battle Creek Central won its third consecutive Five-A track title at Wines field Saturday afternoon.

The Bearcats garnered 58 1/2 points in winning and were followed by Ann Arbor with 48, Jackson with 44, Lansing Eastern with 23 1/2, and Lansing Sexton with nine. Although victory was not theirs, the Pioneers of Ann Arbor scored the most first places with six, followed closely by Battle Creek with five. Jackson runners accounted for two. The Ann Arbor tracksters, who won events were Ted Judson, low hurdles and broad jump; Don Makielski, mile; Ed Makielski, 880; Dick Rogers, pole vault, and Nick Falcone, shot put. Judson was high scorer of the meet with 18 points, taking second place in both the high hurdles and high jump. The only Five-A record to fall was the high jump records of five feet, 10 3/4 inches which fell to Dick Bradley of Battle Creek, who topped the cross bar at six feet even.

Aside from determining the Five-A championship this meet also decided who would go to the state meet at East Lansing Saturday. All men placing first, second or third will be eligible to compete. This applies to all events except the 440 and the relay. The quarter was run in two heats and those placing first or second in either will run in the state. The first two relay teams will also be eligible.
