

### L'ANSE WINNER IN C DIVISION

#### Ewen Takes Crown For Class D and E Schools

Houghton, May 26.—The South St. Marie High school track team won the other peninsula Class B championship race this afternoon, capturing 42 points, to 23 1-2 for Escanaba, who placed second. L'Anse won the Class C title by a narrow margin, 29 1-2 points to 28 for Hancock, in second place. Ewen won the Class D & E championship in another narrow decision, 41 1-2 to 40 second-place Class.

The well rounded breaking performance of the day show registered in the Class C meet. Another set of L'Anse ran the quarter mile in 54.3 seconds and Ebbels of Hancock set a new standard in the Class C 220, running the furthest in 21.2 seconds. The Hancock relay team set a new record in this event, 1:40.1.

The Soo team won the Class B meet easily by securing the best balanced team on the field. The Leek City team scored in every event except the shotput, and won the half mile relay event in the fast time of 1:37.4.

Chasselas lost the Class D title when its hurdler was disqualified in the 200 yard low hurdle. The disqualification cost the Chasselas team four points and it lost the title only by a point and a half.

The high value placed upon community recreation in Escanaba is indicated by the city's budget for the ensuing fiscal year. Expenditures for one form of recreation or another total nearly \$50,000, or one-fourth of the city's entire budget. Of this, only \$15,000 is in the recreational department end, but other expenses for development and maintenance of city projects that are recreational in nature swell the total to nearly \$50,000.

There is an item of \$12,400, for instance, set aside for waterfront development in the next fiscal year. \$27,841 for parks and forestry purposes, \$2,200 for the yacht harbor, \$3,800 for the city airport, \$2,800 for the city band and \$12,200 for the library fund. The grand total of these estimated expenditures is \$73,244 and the city's total budget estimated for the year is \$288,656. These figures prove conclusively that Escanaba riv...
