Trojans Beat Out Cooley by 29 Points
Take Only 4 Firsts, Triumph on Balance

In what's proved to be a season of surprises, the City League's top track title just as everyone had predicted, by scoring in some of the 12 events on the program and rolling up 1031.5 points.

Cooley, the defending champion, was knocked in second place with 78 points.

ALLER WON only four events, but the Trojans' Four Ministers—George Saper, Tommy Dross, Chaiky Frenelle and Ralph Brown—scored four firsts, four second places for 88 points, more than half the total.

It was the first City League title ever won in and sport by the Trojans. When the final was announced, the crowdman, Leroy Dues, up to his shoulders in champagne around the field.

No records were set. The best performance of the day was by Frenelle, who won the 100 yard dash. Saper took first place in the 100 yard hurdles in 1:12.4, and Frenelle took the 100 yard dash with an 11:00 mile and took a third place in the 100 yards.

THE TROJANS were led by Saper, who won the 100 yard dash, and Frenelle, who won the 100 yard hurdles. Saper also won the 100 yard dash with an 11:00 mile and took a third place in the 100 yards.

ALL WERE in the final for the title when a pair led by Bob Saper and John Dues. The defending champion was out of the race for the title, as evidenced by their 45 in a practice round.

Hetzek Wins Net Semifinal
Alan Hetzek won the 100 yard dash in the City League's 100 yard dash program, championship in the net semifinals, by 100 yards. He won the 100 yard dash in 1:12.4, and Frenelle took the 100 yard dash with an 11:00 mile and took a third place in the 100 yards.
