## Byrd, Harmon Head Qualifiers

Post State's Best Scores for PGA Meet

Detroit—AP—Slugging Sam Byrd and methodical Claude Harmon today headed Michigan's list of qualifiers for the National PGA championship July 9-15 at Dayton, Ohio, each with a one over par 145 for 36 holes at Plum Hollow Golf Club, Byrd's home course. Byrd had 76-69; Harmon, 73-72.

Exactly how many qualifiers survived Michigan's sectional test will not be known until the qualifying quota is set next Friday by the PGA tournament committee but Ernie Shave, Michigan PGA secretary, estimated that at least six from Michigan will make the grade.

Back of the leaders were Al Watrous of Oakland Hills and Chick Rutan, Birmingham, tied for third with 152, Frank Walsh, Red Run, 154, and Tommy Shannon, Orchard Lake, 155.

Walter Hagen, a former champion, and Jimmy Gants, Byrd's assistant pro, are exempt from qualifying. Gants under a wartime ruling which permits servicemen discharged since last Jan. 1 to compete in the national tourney without engaging in sectional play.

# Two County Track Titles Are Captured by Kearsley

The track capital of the Genesee County Conference is Kearsley High. That was proved Monday in the annual championship meet at Dort Field. Coach Var-nard Gay's boys registered 74½ points to 62 for Fenton and 22½ for third place Grand Blanc in the boys division. And El-frieda Meida's girls had 28½ to runner-up Grand Blanc's 21 in that category of the competition. So Kearsley rules today as a double champion.

Both the boys leaders scored six firsts and Fenton gained a tie for a seventh win. However, Kearsley's balance paid off as the champions gained 16 other places compared to 13 for the Tigers. Kearsley scored in every event.

There were three double winners in the meet, Jack Suess accomplishing the feat for Kearsley. Jack Stoddard and Ray Steede duplicated for Fenton. Dick Lennon turned in a 10-foot 3¼-inch leap in the broad jump for Flushing's only first and the only outright first that did not go to either Fenton nor Kearsley. Don Roberts of Grand Blanc tied Lee Francis of Fenton at 5 feet 4 inches for high jump laurels. Other firsts went to Fenton's miler, George Howe, who missed a new county record by 1 of a second, and Lee Paro of Kearsley, who excelled in the shot.

With eight events completed, Coach Richards' charges trailed the Tigers by ¼ of a point. Six points gained in the broad jump then started Kearsley on its way to the win and firsts in both heats

The power of the County's one-two combina-tion was emphasized by the fact that three teams, Davison, Bendle, and Beecher—did not score. Flushing had 17 points while Cleo had but 6½ and Good-rich only 3½.

Kearsley's girls took only two of seven firsts but came through with enough other places to win. Joyce Jenkins led the way with 10½ points—scored on a victory in the 50, a tie with teammate Vivian Miller for first in the broad jump, and a fifth in the hop, step, and jump. Florence Drews of Grand Blanc was another double winner, taking the basketball and baseball throws.
