The Bear thinclads placed third with Cooper taking first in the half-mile, Duve second and third in the high and low hurdles respectively. The 880 relay team comprised of Branch, McKenna, Caterino and Mitchell took second place.

Mitchell and McKenna both took fourth in the 440 yard and 60 yard dash respectively.

April 23, Lincoln Park was downed 69-35 at the first track meet of the season.

Ecorse drubbed the Cindermen 63-41 at a meet April 25.

Don Cooper broke Roosevelt's seventeen year old half-mile indoor record unofficially when he ran the 12 laps in 2:15.5.

Equalling Ann Arbor's interscholastic 60 yard dash mark was Jim McKenna as he spurted down the hall in :06.5.

Showing much promise is second semester freshman Bob Hensman, a quarter-miler.
