

1945 Prep Track Kings Out to Repeat

Denby, Miller Win Openers with Ease

Denby and Miller, the top teams of last year's City League indoor track season, served notice that they are still powerful. Denby trounced Eastern, 75½ to 10½, and Miller downed Southeastern, 71 to 15, in season openers.

Denby, defending champion, grand-slammed four events and took first place in every event except the high hurdles. The slams came in the mile, half-mile, quarter-mile and high jump.

TOMMY STEWART won the 30-yard dash, low hurdles and tied for first in the pole vault, for high-point honors. Mickey Rogula won the 220-yard dash, finished second in the 30-yard event, ran the anchor on the winning half-mile relay team and tied with two teammates for first in the high jump.

Miller also grand-slammed four events—the pole vault, high jump and both low and high hurdles. The Trojans captured eight first places, losing only the mile and quarter-mile.

George Sayles was high-point man with firsts in the low hurdles, high hurdles and pole vault. Jesse Nimmons won the 30 and 220-yard dashes and ran on the winning half-mile relay team. Ralph Rowan was runner-up to Sayles in the two hurdle events and also ran on the relay team.

WITH LEON WINGO winning three first places, Hamtramck defeated Cass Tech, 47½ to 38½. Wingo took the 30 and 220-yard dashes and the low hurdles and ran anchor on the winning relay team. Hamtramck took first place in six of the nine events.

Northern nosed out Pershing, 44 1-3 to 41 2-3. Jimmy Wilson placed first in the 30 and 220-yard dashes and the low hurdles and anchored the relay team.

Northwestern won six first places to beat Mackenzie, 50 to 36. Don Godbold was high-point man, winning both hurdle events and anchoring the relay. Bob Flisinger, Northwestern's All-City cross-country star, won the mile in 4:49.4.

Northeastern edged out Western in a non-league meet, 43½ to 42½.
