

Cosmos Lose to Northern
Four Teams Unbeaten in City League Track

Northern knocked Hamtramck from the ranks of the undefeated, scoring a 55-31 triumph in a City League high school indoor track dual meet.

Jim Wilson paced Northern, winning the low hurdles and 220-yard dash and anchoring the victorious half-mile relay team. The Eskimos took seven out of 10 first places.

DENBY, COOLEY, Northwestern and Miller remained unbeaten, with Northwestern turning in the most impressive victory. The Colts downed Southwestern, 78½ to 7½, taking every event except the thirty-yard dash.

Cooley captured eight first places in downing Central, 70 to 16. George Henry, Cardinal speedster, won the low hurdles and 30-yard dash and tied with three teammates for first in the pole vault.

Denby, defending City League champion, trounced Pershing, 69½ to 16½, winning nine events. Mickey Rogula and Tommy Stewart shared high point honors for Denby, with 14½.

MILLER WON a non-league affair from Redford, 52 to 34. Southwestern downed Cass Tech, 50½ to 35½; Northeastern defeated Eastern, 58½ to 27½, and Mackenzie beat Western 58 5/6 to 27 1/6 in other meets.

Al Foley, of Mackenzie, broke the Western gym record in winning the pole vault with a mark of 11 feet 5½ inches.
