

Denby Still Undefeated

Four Track Squads Boast Perfect Marks

Denby, Miller, Cooley and Northwestern finished the City League indoor track dual meet season unbeaten, and began preparations for the East and West League meets next week.

The defending champion Denby squad downed previously unbeaten Northern, 65 $\frac{2}{3}$ to 20 $\frac{1}{3}$. Denby took eight first places and tied for first in the remaining event—the high jump.

MILLER HAD ITS closest call of the year, beating Eastern, 54 to 32. The Trojans took six first places and tied in another event. James Nixon, Miller half-miler, set an Eastern track record of 2:10.

Cooley took seven firsts in crushing Southwestern, 63 $\frac{5}{6}$ to 22 $\frac{1}{6}$ Northwestern trounced Hamtramck, 72 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 13 $\frac{1}{2}$, as Don Godbold won the high hurdles and 220-yard and finished second in the low hurdles and 30-yard dash.

Al Foley set a pole vault record for the MacKenzie gym, as MacKenzie beat Redford, 48 $\frac{2}{3}$ to 37 $\frac{1}{3}$. Foley's mark of 11-feet-9 was an inch better than the City League record, but will not go on the league books, since it was not made in a league final or semi-final meet.

In other meets, Pershing edged Southeastern, 45 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 40 $\frac{1}{2}$, and Western beat Central, 48 to 38. Northeastern drubbed Cass Tech, 56 to 30.
