

ROMULUS TAKES B-C-D TITLE

Arthur Hill's Balance Captures Rouge Relays

ANN ARBOR—Flashing surprising balance, Saginaw Arthur Hill's High School ran off with the Class A championship at the seventh annual River Rouge Relays before 2,000 spectators in Yost Field House.

The Lumberjacks amassed 36 3/5 points while placing in nine of the meet's 11 events. Arthur Hill, which won the crown in 1944, displaced Saginaw High as Class A King. Saginaw finished second with 34 7/10 points.

The Hillites won despite the fact that they topped but one event outright—the medley relay—and tied for first in the pole vault.

ROMULUS, State Class C outdoor king, captured the Class B-C-D title with 21 1/2 points, outdistancing 45 other squads.

Allegan and Ecorse tied for second place in Class B-C-D with 19 points.

The meet, largest indoor track carnival ever held in Michigan, drew 825 entries from 65 schools.

Arthur Hill launched its drive with the distance medley relay by coming from behind to nose out Saginaw by three yards. The relay victory gave the Hillites an early ten-point lead and their splendid balance did the rest.
