# Arthur Hill Nips Saginaw

ANN ARBOR, April 13 (AP) — The crosstown rivalry between two Saginaw track teams, which for the past three years has featured the River Rouge invitational relays, tonight was decided in favor of Arthur Hill high school by less than two points in the Class A division at Yost field house.

Arthur Hill, holder of the 1944 title and runner-up to Saginaw last year in the battle for unofficial state indoor track and field champion, racked up 37.3 points to Saginaw's 35.5.

In third place was Wyandotte with 29.2 points, while Muskegon (21), Flint Central (20.5) and Ann Arbor (19) finished in fourth, fifth and sixth places.

Romulus high school topped the Class B-C-D division with 21.5, heading off both Allegan and Ecorse, which ended in a second-place tie with 19 points apiece, Alma and Ypsilanti Central tied for fourth with 17 3-7 points and Mt. Pleasant was sixth with 16.

Although the Class A outcome was close at the finish, Arthur Hill was never headed from the moment its distance medley relay team copped 10 points at the beginning of the finals.

Romulus, state interscholastic Class C champion, was sparked to its victory by "Spud" Schultz, the only man in the meet able to capture a pair of firsts — the 65-yard high and low hurdles.

The only meet record to tumble was the one-mile run in which Milan's Allen Hasler, breaking into a sprint in the last lap, made the distance in 4:51.5, shading the old mark of 4:42.3.
