Charlotte Tops Field In Class B

East Grand Rapids Comes Through in Class C - Flint Def in D

Saginaw high school, with virtually no seniors on its squad, retained its Class A Michigan high school track championship today before 2,100 non-seated fans at Michigan State college, beating out its city rival, Saginaw Arthur Hill, 36 1/2 points to 26.

Because of the rain, which fell all morning and half way through the meet, there were the state records made in all of the non-covered preliminary classes.

Charlotte with 37 points, secured the Class B championship while East Grand Rapids was the winner in Class C, 20 1/2 and Michigan School C, 17 1/2.

Saginaw, winning the first field event of the morning, when R. D. McKinnon captured the shot put scored in eight of the 14 events and

White-Weaver Top Charlotte Scoring

Charlotte high won its first Class B state track championship in history yesterday at Michigan State college when seven Oriole tracksters rolled up 37 points, 23 coming from the combined efforts of Chuck Weaver and Doug White. John Fleming of Lansing Eastern achieved another noteworthy feat in finishing to victory in the Class A 1100-yard dash.

The new Class B champs took an early lead when White and Doug Weymouth finished one-two in the 1200-ft high hurdles and Bob Moore sailed to third place in the pole vault. Don Moore followed with a sixth in the 800 ft after which White took a second in the 200-yd low hurdles and Weaver added a second in the 220.

Ray Maden came through with two more precious points when he finished third in his heat of the 440. The school relay team composed of Maden, Louck, White and Weaver, finished the team for Charlotte by coming home in third place.

Bobden Fremont's victory in the 100, Don Jewell leaped to fourth place in the broad jump to give the Quakers a nine-point total for the afternoon.

Other area point winners included Jim Harbo of Everett who came in fourth in the Class B high hurdles and Sanderson of Powerville who finished in a tie for sixth place in the Class C high jump. (By Associated Press.)

Pitt Makes Bid Panthers Ask Big 10 Spot

PITTSBURGH, May 25 (UPI)—The University of Pittsburgh has formally asked for membership in the Big Ten, an announcement released yesterday.

Pitt announcement confirmed an open secret — that the school has longed for Big Ten representation for many years.

The announcement said that the school has not made formal application for membership, but has informed the Big Ten secretary that the university does desire membership.

A statement signed by R. E. Sherrill, chairman of Pitt's faculty committee on athletic policy and James Hagan, director of athletics, said "The University of Pittsburgh has long desired to join the Big Ten conference in the western conference. The faculty committee on athletic policy of the university, had, however, informed the conference faculty representatives through their secretary that the university does desire conference membership."

The school has been mentioned by the fact that W. W. Pender, former Ohio State star, is now Pitt coach.

Lanier, Martin Set To Leave Monday

ST. LOUIS, May 25 (UPI)—Two Louisiana Cardinals stars, pitcher Max Lanier and Fred Martin, said respectively today they were "not shifting" on their threat to jump to the Mexican League.

The action followed here an issue which is said they would leave Monday.

Lanier and Martin came here by train from Chicago. They had flown from Baltimore to Chicago. They refused to discuss the whereabouts of Second Baseman Lou Klein, the third Cardinal who is reported jumping.

also finished first in the final relay. Romulus, the 1945 champion, finished third with 21 1-3.

Two of the meet's five individual "double" winners were in Class D, where Arlon Dennison, state record holder in both sprints, repeated his 1945 championships in both events to pace Michigan School for the Deaf to a hard-earned victory to match its 1945 title. Baldwin, with 43 points, was just six points off the Flint institution's pace.

Don Plonta, Bayport's field event hero, captured both the broad jump and high jump in Class D.

Nearest thing to a record performance came from Allen Hosler, Milan's Class C miler, whose four minutes 35.6 seconds was just a half second of the meet's best previous time.

Michigan Deaf's Dennison, Ecorse's Rogers and Ypsilanti Roosevelt's Gundrum, all ran anchor legs on winning relay teams to share individual high point honors for the meet with 13½ points.

A total of 157 schools came out of last week's regional meets with 751 eligibles for the state finals, although all the qualifiers did not show up for today's championships.
