

Thumb Schools Score In State Track Meet

East Lansing, May 25—AP—Saginaw High School, with virtually no seniors on its squad, retained its class A Michigan high school track championship Saturday before 2,500 rain-soaked fans at Michigan State College, beating out its city rival, Saginaw Arthur Hill, 36½ points to 28.

Because of the rain, which fell all morning and half way through the meet, there were no state records broken in any of the four lower peninsula classes.

Charlotte, with 37 points, annexed the class B championship while East Grand Rapids was the winner in class C with 31. Michigan School for the Deaf won the class D meet with 52.

Port Huron High, which sent three qualifiers to the meet, Andy Balogh, Jack McKay and Ken Proctor, did not score.

Several District schools placed in class C. Imlay City scored a total of nine points, for twelfth place; Marine City, 4½, for twentieth; Bad Axe, 2, good for twenty-fifth, and Algonac just got into the marking column with 1/6 of a point to tie for last place.
