Cooley Annexes Prep Track Title

Cardinals' Balance Deciding Factor as They Capture Only One 1st Place

Cooley High School took only one first place in the City League outdoor track finals at Denby, but the Cardinals' balance won the championship.

Ross Smith won the mile to provide Cooley's only first, and his teammates Dave Rice and Bob Hahn followed him across the finish line to give Cooley 15 points in that event alone.

All told, the Cardinals scored four seconds, three thirds, a fourth, two fifths and four sixths in the individual events, and tied for fifth in the 880-yard relay.

Final scores were Cooley 59; Denby 33, Miller 31, Northwestern 27, Pershing 20, Hamtramck 16, Northeastern 13, Mackenzie 11½, Southeastern and Southwestern 9½ each, Northern 8, Redford 8, Western 6, Cass Tech 5, Central 1½; and Eastern 1.

Redford upset the favored Hamtramck High School tennis team to take the City League championship, 3 to 2, at Northwestern Field.

Coches C. W. Sayres, of Redford, jugged his line-up, sending Jack Chambers, formerly a doubles player, into the No. 1 singles spot. This moved Charles Oakman, the former Redford No. 1 man to the No. 2 berth, and likewise shoved Tom Sayres, formerly No. 2, down a notch.
