

Miller Fails to Threaten

Tars' Tom Stewart Tops Individuals By GEORGE PUSCAS

Strength in the mile and halfmile brought Cooley High School its second straight City League indoor track championship at Central Friday.

The Cardinals, who won the crown for the sixth time in 10 years, picked up first and third places in each of the distance events to account for more than half of their 38-point total.

MILLER, which was expected to fight Cooley to the final event, dropped out of the contention early in the meet. Aaron Gordon, the league's cross-country champion, fell and went unplaced in the mile to end Miller's hones.

The Trojans nipped Denby for secondary honors with 31½ points, however. The Tars scored 31 points, Redford 21½; Northwestern 21, Western 17½, Eastern 10, Southeastern 9, Hamtramck 71½, Mackenzie 4½; Southwestern 3½; Pershing 8 and Northern 2½.

Denby's relay team of Harr Bears, Don Keller, Bruno Boelstle and Tom Stewart produced the meet's only record. They toured the 880-yard distance in 1:35.5, clipping 7 seconds off the mark shared by Central and Northwestern.
