

Grand Blanc, Vassar and MSD Regional Track Champs

Hughes Stars For Tartars

Haslett Proves Surprisingly Strong

Grand Blanc, Vassar, and Michigan School for the Deaf won the Class B, C, and D Regional track titles in the annual meet held on Dort Field Saturday with points to spare. Grand Blanc compiled 40 1/7 points while Vassar ran up 51 8/10 and the Tartars 68 5/12 for the class titles.

Morris Hughes of MSD turned out to be the individual star of the meet, scoring firsts in the high and broad jump, in which he set new Class D Regional records despite coggy conditions, and the 440-yard dash. Hughes' 20-foot, 3 1/2-inch leap in the broad jump and 5-feet, 6 1/2-inch effort in the high jump posted new standards for future Class D track stars.

Roland Moore, who finished second to Teammate Hughes in the high jump, and captured the low hurdles, heaved the shot put 41 feet, 11 inches for another new Class D record.

Pacing Grand Blanc to their first place total in Class B was Bill Teer, winner of the high hurdles and sharer of first place ties in pole vault and high jump. John Metivier of Bendle was the only other Class B entry to win more than one first place. Metivier, who doubles as Bendle's top baseball hurler, copped both dash medals besides running the anchor leg on the winning 880 relay team.

Vassar sported two double winners in Jim Bernard, 100 and 220-yard dash champ, and Jim Smith, who won both hurdle races. Bernard with third and Smith with fourth brought the Class C champions points in the shot put also.

Most surprising performance of the meet was Haslett's strong bid for second place in Class D with only a seven-man crew. Only a pulled muscle in the left leg of Joe Metro, previous winner of the Haslett team from winning the 880-yard relay. Metro, handling the anchor chore in the relay, fell to the track with his cramping leg muscle only 10 yards from the finish line after leading the field by twice that distance. The game Haslett runner tried to cross the finish line on all-fours but saw three other runners pass him before he could scramble the distance.

Leading team counts in Class B were Grand Blanc with 40 1/7, Kearsley with 24 25/28, Lapeer with 24 11/28, and Mt. Morris, 23 3/4 points. Vassar amassed 51 8/10, Saginaw Lutheran Seminary 24 3/10, Bad Axe 21 8/10, an dCorunna, last year's winner, 22 9/10 to lead the Class C field. MSD ran away with Class D with a 68 5/12 count. Utley was second with 27 1/2, Haslett third with 25, and Birch Run fourth with 11 1/4.

Of the winners in each event the top three will go to the State meet in East Lansing next Saturday with the exception of Class D which limits qualifiers for the State finals to the first and second place winners in each event.

Four Michigan Men Exempt for Tests

Detroit—AP—More than two dozen of Michigan's top professional golfers will contest Monday at Detroit Golf Club for five sectional qualifying positions in the 1947 PGA championship.

Four Michigan men are exempt from qualifying—Walter Hagen as a former winner, Sam Byrd as the host professional, Horton Smith as a member of the Ryder Cup team and Chick Harbert, who obtained special dispensation because he is competing in a tourney at Ft. Worth, Tex., and cannot return home in time for the trials.

Tommy Shannon, Michigan PGA secretary, said Michigan may have more than nine representatives in the tournament since the State will be awarded additional qualifying berths if other states fail to fill their quota.
