Leslie Favored In Monday Bout

New Orleans—Jock Leslie, the Michigan heavy punching featherweight, and Freddie Russo, classy boxing Rahway, N. J., 130-pounder, wound up hard training Saturday for their 12-round return bout here Monday night, with the wise railbirds predicting that Jock will repeat his victory over the easterner.

The pair boxed 10 fast rounds here last March 24, with Leslie getting the decision. That was a 10-rounder and Russo asked for a return match with the stipulation it be for a longer distance.

He said he believed he could beat Jock if given a little more time. So Promoter Louis Messina, Les Krell, pilot of Leslie, and Russo's handlers agreed on the 12-round route for the return bout.

Both fighters have trained strenuously, with Russo looking much better in workouts than he did for his first battle with the blond Michigan terror. He will have a pull of four or five pounds in the weights, the Leslie end of the contract having agreed to 130 pounds at weighing in time Monday noon. Leslie probably will be at around 125, his usual fighting weight, with Russo at 130, his natural poundage.

Promoter Messing reports a heavy advance sale for the bout, which will be staged in the Municipal Auditorium, with a seating capacity of around 10,000. The March fight drew nearly \$9,000 and would have gone higher but for the fact that it was held in the small Coliseum Arena, seating around 5,000. A thousand fans were turned away.
