Trojans Top Huge Field

Alma Rules Class B; Baroda Wins D Title

EAST LANSING—Saginaw High School rules as Michigan's Class A track king for the third straight year.

The Trojans won six firsts established one record and scored in seven of the 12 events to roll up 42½ points. Flint Northern, its closest rival, scored 31 points.

Saginaw Arthur Hill placed third with 27½, followed by Battle Creek, 20½, and Jackson, 20.

Alma and Baroda, two schools which fought their way to state basketball titles just two months ago, were to track championships before a record crowd of 5,000 fans.

Alma amassed 25½ points to edge Hastings and Keweenaw for the Class B crown. Hastings totaled 23½ points to an even 23 for Keweenaw.

Baroda outdistanced the Class D field to win with 33½ points. Paw Paw won its first Class C crown since 1935 with 30½ points.

FOUR RECORDS were smashed and two tied by the 900 athletes who competed in the meet.

Mary Cichowski sparked Saginaw with a record-shattering 27.8 mark in the 200-yard low hurdles. Chuck Kocman, of Milan, tossed the shot 61 feet 8½ inches for a Class C record.

Glen Rowe topped the 200-yard low hurdles in 23 seconds flat for a Class C record. Dan Haven set a 120-yard high hurdles mark of 16 seconds flat.

Jack Phister, Birmingham's stellar quarter-mile, tied a 14-year-old record when he sped the 440 yards in 59.9. Bob Shultz, Alma's all-around athlete, also tied the Class B high hurdle mark of 15.4.

FLINT CENTRAL'S Art Ingram and Will Reese, of Gallen, were the meet's only double winners.

Ingram copped the Class A 100- and 220-yard dashes in 18.1 and 22.7, respectively. Reese picked up his twin triumphs in field events, setting 11 feet 3 inches in the pole vault and 5 feet 7 inches in the high jump.

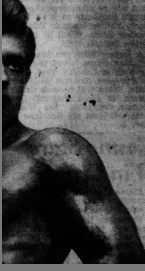
Sharing honors with Phister from the Metropolitan Detroit area was Grosse Ile's Nyikos. The speedy Red Devil star won the Class D century in 1:53 and placed second in the 220 and broad jump.

Other Detroit-area winners were John Whitbold, of Grosse Ile, in the Class D shot put; Dick Graves, of Birmingham, in the Class B shot; Warden Gilliam, of River Rouge, in the Class B 440; and Redford Union's Roger Brown in the Class B 200-yard low hurdles.
