

Crown to Saginaw As 4 Records Fall

EAST LANSING, May 24—Outstanding individual performances that produced four new state records overshadowed Saginaw High School's winning of a third straight state Class A track championship here today.

Outstanding of the two new marks set in Class C was by Milan's John Koozman, who threw the shot 51 feet 9½ inches bettering by almost three feet Stanley Bocek's 49 feet. 2 inches made in 1941. Bocek represented Corunna High.

Another Class C record that fell was in 200 yards low hurdles when Glen Rowe posted a 23 seconds time, to top a mark of 23.5 set in 1942 by George Brown of Ann Arbor University high.

Saginaw's Marvin Cichowsky scattered the only class A record, doing a 22.6 in the 220 yards low hurdles. He bested a 22.8 time set in 1944 by Garion Campbelle of Monroe.

In Class D Dan Haven of Hemlock did the 120-yard high hurdles in 16 seconds flat for a new state standard, which is three tenths of

a second faster than that set by Robert Hall of Bloomfield Hills in 1938.

Saginaw's well-balanced squad hung up 42½ points to put the Trojans well ahead of their nearest rival, Flint Central, which finished second with 31.

Alma edged by Hastings and Ecorse to annex the Class B title, the winners had 25½ tallies to Hastings' 23 5-12 and Ecorse's 23.

Paw Paw paced the field in Class C, winning easily on 30½ tallies.

Baroda topped the Class D entry list with 30½ points. Baldwin ranked second with 33 9-10 and Michigan School for the Deaf, defending champion, was third with 29.
