

Trojans Nip Flint Team By 11 Points

Alma Replaces Charlotte as "B" Champs; Paw Paw, Baroda Also Win

Four new track records were written into the books Saturday as Saginaw high school retained its state Class A championship and Alma, Paw Paw, and Baroda annexed new lower peninsula titles in Classes B, C, and D, respectively. A record crowd of over 5,000 fans witnessed the 40th annual carnival.

The Class A team struggle ended in a strictly Saginaw Valley Conference scramble as expected, Flint Central placing second to Saginaw with 31 points and Saginaw Arthur Hill finishing third with 27 5-6.

Saginaw's team total was 42 1-3, six points more than it scored in beating out Arthur Hill in last year's event.

Charlotte failed to gain a first place in the Class B race and yielded its title to Alma, which finished with 25 1-3 points. Hastings was a close second with 23 5-12 points. Escorpe third with 22, Frezmont fourth with 22 and Charlotte fifth with 16.

Paw Paw captured first place in both two events but piled up enough markers in the runner-up positions to finish first in Class C with 20 points. Ypsilanti Roosevelt, with 22, beat out its city rival, Ypsilanti Lincoln, by two points, for second place honors.

Baroda had 20 1/2 points for first position in the Class D team track. Baldwin was second with 33 and

Michigan School for the Deaf, last year's winner, was third with 29.

Hurdler Mary Cichowski of Saginaw was the lone record-breaker in Class A as he navigated the low sticks in 22.6 seconds, two-tenths of a second faster than the old mark held by Garion Campbell of Monroe. Other Trojan firsts were garnered by Bill Conley in the 440 yard dash, Jim Johnson in the high jump, Tom Keyes in the broad jump, K. D. McKinnon in the shot put and the mile medley relay team.

Flint Central's speedster, Art Ingram, was the only double winner in Class A, winning both the 100 and 220 yard dashes.

Fremont scored two firsts and two seconds in the Class B section, but lacked strength in the runner-up positions and yielded to Alma, which had only one first place — Bob Schultz' victory in the 120 yard high hurdles. Hastings had two firsts and could have won the meet by taking the 880 yard relay, last event on the program. The Hastings team won its heat, but placed only fifth as the times of teams in the other heats were better.

Schultz equalled the Class B record of 15.4 seconds when he won the high hurdles. Jack Phister of Birmingham also equalled a record when he galloped over the 440 yard route in 50.9 seconds.

The best record-shattering performance of the day was turned in by John Koczman of Milan when he topped the standard in the Class C shot put by two and one-half feet. He tossed the 12-pound weight 61 feet, 8 1/4 inches. Ypsilanti Lincoln's Glen Rowe clipped half a second off the Class C 200 yard low hurdles mark with his 23 seconds flat performance.

Herrlock's Dan Haven was the only Class D record breaker. He ran the 120 yard low timbers in 16 seconds flat, shaving three-tenths of a second off the old standard.

The only Lansing athlete to capture a title was Eastern's Bob Nagel, who cleared 11 feet 10 inches in the Class A pole vault event. Eastern's other point maker was Ken Maletzke, who took third in one of the 880 yard races. Sexton's Linton Stewart finished third in one of the Class A 440 heats, East Lansing's Bob Pierson was fourth in one of the Class B 440 races, and Everett's Jim Rambo finished third in the Class B shot put.

Doug White was Charlotte's high point man with a second in the high hurdles, a fourth in the lows and a fifth in the broad jump. Other Oriole point winners were Bob Mohre, who tied for second in the pole vault, and Ray Radee, who took third in one of the 440 heats.
