

## Battle Creek High Trackmen Win Allegan Invitational Meet

ALLEGAN— (U.P.) —Battle Creek won the class A championship in the Allegan Invitational High School Track meet here yesterday with 67½ points.

Fremont took the class B division with 37 points and Paw Paw won class C with 71 points.

Get 3 Firsts

The Bearcats scored their victory by registering three firsts, a half dozen second places and by placing nine other runners as point-getters.

Owen Anderson led Coach Bob Mowerson's contingent with a first in the high jump with a five foot, seven-inch leap and by placing second in the pole vault.

Tom Goretzka, state high school mile titlist, didn't let down any as he paced the field in that event yesterday with a four minutes, 44.9 seconds performance.

The other first place was annexed by George Markham who won the shot put event with a 48 foot, seven-inch heave.

Mendell Vaughns scored second in the broad jump and thirds in each of the 100 and 220-yard dashes.

Other seconds were registered by the Bearcat medley and 880-yard relays; by John Miller in the 200-yard low hurdles and Norman Amos, who trailed Markham in the shot.

Harold Mull picked up fourths in each the broad jump and the high jump and Bernard Gilmore placed fourth in the 440. Flyod Watkins had a fourth in the 220-yard dash and a fifth in the 100. Harold Coss finished the scoring for the Battle Creek winners with a tie for fifth in the pole vault.
