High School Track Team Wins Again

Powerful Pioneers Have Easy Time With Rouge; Two New Marks Created

Ann Arbor High's high-flying track team inked its fourth straight indoor dual meet victory this spring into the record books today and prepared for a vacation rest before heading into the intensive part of the outdoor campaign.

Coach Tim Ryan's powerful Pioneers won all but one event yesterday afternoon to subdue River Rouge, 69-13. The Ann Arborites set two new school records, tied another and scored sweeps in the quarter-mile, half-mile and mile runs as well as in the pole vault competition.

Mark Ford's 5.5-second effort in the low hurdles tied the school record. The Pioneer relay team of Ford, Verne Nixon, A. D. Evans and Bob Fowler whirled through that event in 1:13.7 to better the old mark of 1:13.8. Joe Grammatico's 10-foot, 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch pole vault improved the former mark of 10 feet, 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches.
