

## New High School Records Are Set In Rouge Relays

ANN ARBOR (UP) — Saginaw, Ypsilanti and Dundee high schools captured individual team championships in the tenth annual River Rouge relays Saturday when 11 meet records fell and four others were tied.

The Saginaw lads, who were state track champs last year, totaled 32 points to capture their fourth Class A crown. Jackson, with 34, placed second while Saginaw Arthur Hill and Fordson were tied for third with 26 1/2 each.

Ypsilanti defended its Class B title, piling up 36-1/2 points.

Dundee high turned out to be the only new champion as it scored 48 points.

More than 850 schoolboys from 80 state high schools were on hand for the meet, the largest prep indoor track carnival in the nation.

Two new records came in the high jump. Milt Mead of Bay City Central soared six feet 2 3/8 inches to set a new Class A mark and Gene Johnson of River Rouge set a new Class B record with his jump of five feet 11 5/8 inches.

Dale Davis of Belleville wrote a meet record into the books in the mile with his time of 4:40.2. He thus clipped 12 seconds off the fastest mile ever run in a Michigan high school meet.

Two record shot puts were recorded. Don Schiesswohl of Arthur Hill hit the 53-foot 9-inch mark for the Class A record and Dick Fisher of Trenton made a throw of 48-feet 7-1/2 inches for the best Class B toss.

Jim Wagenchultz of Plymouth bested the old Class B pole vault mark of 11-feet 6-inches by three inches. Don Hickman of Ypsilanti ran a 53.7 victory in the 440 to clip a second off the old record and Gaylor Snyder of Vestaburg skimmed the low hurdles in 7.8 seconds for a new record.

Other Class C-D record-breaking efforts were turned in by the Dundee half-mile relay team which was clocked at 1:38.1 and West Baxenbale of South Lake who turned in a time of 2:06.1 in the half-mile.

Non-trout streams and Great Lakes waters are open to fishing the year around.
