

Ponder Rates as Third Choice in Bett

County Track Records Fall

Goodrich, Grand Blanc, Flushing Prevail

Nine records were broken Friday at Dora Field as the annual County League track meet got off to a flying start and finished the same way. Grand Blanc carried off top honors in the boys' Class B, while Goodrich outdistanced all opposition in the Class C meet. Flushing's girls took Class B tournament, while Goodrich made it a clean sweep, their girls also winning.

Grand Blanc had 43 1/2 points, Bendle 30 1/2, Mt. Morris 30, Flushing 28, Davison 27, Kearley 10, Fenton 13, and Beecher 7 in class B. In class C it was Goodrich with 56 1/2, Dye with 54 1/2, Utley 20 2/5, Oliville 22 2/5, Hoover and Swartz Creek each with 14, Mt. Morris St. Mary's 9 1/3, and Linden with 4.

Flushing's victorious feminine team scored 42 points, as compared to Beecher's 31, Kearley with 24, Mt. Morris 11, Bendle with 8, and Grand Blanc with 4. Goodrich piled up 58 points, Oliville 29, Gaines 22, and Utley 10 to round out the Class C scoring.

Bill Brendel of Grand Blanc broke the record he shared with two others in the 120-yard high hurdles to aid his team's victory. He was clocked in 15.4. Kearley's Bob Griswold skinned the stakes in 198.1, to break the 200-yard low hurdle mark, also breaking one of his own records.

Outstanding performance of the day was turned in by Leo St. John of Flushing, who took both dummies, as well as placing second in the broad jump and running a leg of the second-place mesley relay team. St. John turned in a good time of 1:29 in the 220.

Donna Sabbadino of the Beecher Class B girls' team received three blue ribbons, for breaking two records and running a lap on the victorious 220-yard relay team. Miss Sabbadino's hop-step-and-jump mark of 32 feet 2 1/2 inches breaks the old record, while her 182-foot 9 inch heave tops by a foot the existing record in the softball throw.

Other outstanding performances were turned in by Tom Wood of Grand Blanc in the shot put, Bob Boring of Swartz Creek in the shot put, Ronnie Weir of Grand Blanc in the broad jump, and Corky Corcoran of Mt. Morris St. Mary's in the mile. Double winners in addition to Miss Sabbadino and St. John were Dye's Bob Bennett, who topped the timers in both highs and lows to win those events in Class C, Donna Boulton of Beecher, who won the running broad jump and ran a leg of the 220-yard relay, and Nancy Fell of Goodrich, who took both the softball and basketball throws, breaking the record in the latter.

Two ninth graders shared in the winning, as Corcoran, the miler, and Dick Zerbe of Dye both took a shot. Zerbe won the 880 going away in 2:14.2.

Newcomer Wins Detroit Opener

Detroit — AP — What may be the last season of horse racing at the State Fairgrounds here is well under way here after an opener attended by 19,363 fans.

Those who saw the first day's activities in the 80-day season wagered a total of \$946,423. Of that, \$103,000 came through the windows on the sixth race, the \$10,000 Curtain Up Handicap.

In that race a newcomer, Papa Redbird, nosed out one of the favorites, Porter's Broom. Star Reward was third, and another favorite, Plot, fourth.

The winner paid \$9.20, \$5.20 and \$4.40; Porter's Broom, \$5.60 and \$4.60; and Star Reward, \$4.80.

Magna Carta Gives Irish Fishermen Right to Angle

Dublin — AP — Irishmen take their fishing seriously.

So seriously that the Dublin high court was asked to decide whether 80 Donegal fishermen had the right to wet their lines in a three-mile tributary of the Lough Foyle, the river which runs through Northern Ireland and Eire.

The Irish Society, founded 335 years ago by King James I to administer crown estates in Ulster, claimed it owned the fishing rights under royal charters received in 1613 and 1632. Hundreds of documents, many dating from the 13th century, were introduced.

For 48 days the court hearing droned on. Costs were estimated at 200,000 pounds (\$800,000). Justice Gavan Duffy gave his decision. The 80 Donegal fishermen won the right to fish the river. Any charters granting the rights to the Irish Society were contrary to the Magna Carta, Justice Duffy said.
