## Birmingham Coasts

### Maples Rely on Sprinters in Class B

#### Ypsilanti's Dave Hill Cracks 3 Records

EAST LANSING—Baldwin High, of Birmingham, concentrating its strength in the dashes, hurdles and relay, swept its fifth State Class B high school track championship here Saturday.

The Maples placed first and second in both the 100 and 220 yard dashes, romped home second and third in the high hurdles and took 2-0-0 relay in determining Ypsilanti as tilth.

Success in the dashes, hurdles and relays accounted for 43 of the 47.6 points which the Maples collected during the day. Ypsi was a distant second with 24 points.

SAGINAW DOMINATED the Class A field for the fifth straight year, polling up 64 points to 23 1/2 for second place. Arthur Hill, of Saginaw, won the 100 yard dash in 14.8 seconds, a record in this class. He swept over the high hurdles in 1:15, was timed in 1:17.7 in the low and won the broad jump with a record leap of 32 feet 1 1/2 inches.

Just for good measure he tied for third in the high jump.

ST. ROSE, of Detroit, made a creditable showing in its first State meet in history.

The St. Rose accumulated 15 points in Class C when Pete Cull won the 100-yard dash, placed second in the 200 and anchored his relay team, which placed fifth.

Bernard Schmitz posted up a fifth for St. Rose in the 220.

JACK GOODRIDGE was the muck with other double winners as he swept hurdles in five class State title. Goodridge won both hurdle events, his 115 feet in the high setting a record, and leaped 21 feet 7 1/2 inches to win the broad jump.

Records rolled up an 7:10 points to 29 for second place East Grand Rapids.

Hill Baxter, Fordson sprinter, was the only double winner in Class A. Baxter won both the 100 and 200-yard dashes.

SAGINAW PLACED in nine of the 12 events while displaying its expected balance. In addition to its two winning relay teams, Warren Kreyes and Jim Mills were the only other Saginaw winners.

Kreyes won the broad jump, edging out Ralph Leck, of Grand Rapids. Ottawa Hills, on his final lap to hold an inch, Edna won his section of the 440-yard dash.

Nine records were written by the 1,048 athletes competing from 218 schools.
