East Thinclads Lose Title, Trailing Second in Class C

Saginaw Annexes Class A Crown; Birmingham Is B King; Dundee Rules C Ranks

East Lansing—Approximately 1,200 young athletes, representing the cream of 218 Michigan high school thinclad teams formed a gala spectacle here Saturday as they vied for team and individual honors in classes A, B, C and D track and field events.

As the wisecracks predicted Saginaw High school's Lumberjacks carried too much punch for the rest of the class A schools, and for the fifth consecutive year walked off with top laurels.

Birmingham, last year's runner-up in Class B reversed the tables this year and pushed the defending champion, Ypsilanti, into second place. Grand Rapids East lost its crown to a well balanced Dundee outfit, and Michigan School for the Deaf, second to Bloomfield Hills last year in class D, changed seats with the drivers and easily annexed the lower class crown.

Saginaw Arthur Hill gave the Lumberjacks a merry time of it in the morning events, but the boys of Coach Herb Korf came through in the afternoon to build up their point total to 44. The Trojans trailed a poor second with 25%. Kalamazoo's Maroon Giants garnered third place honors with 23 3/5 points, while Jackson took fourth with 18.

31 Teams Score.

Grand Rapids Ottawa Hills fared the best of the Furniture city contingent, taking fifth, nine-tenths of a point behind Jackson. Catholic Central garnered 10 1/2 points for tenth place in the ratings while Creston and Union added two points apiece to the Grand Rapids total, which merited them a tie for twenty-fourth spot among the 31 teams that broke into the class A scoring column.

Of the nine meet records that were shattered during the day, only one was of class A caliber. It was Saginaw's medley team that marked up a new time of 2:33.7, besting the mark set up by Benton Harbor.

Birmingham won the B title with 49 1/2 points as Ypsilanti settled for second with 29. Grand Rapids Godwin with 15 trailed in fifth. Class B marks were the least respected of any.

The Birmingham medley relay time of 2:33.4 broke the old mark of 2:38.2 set by River Rouge a year ago. Ypsilanti's Dave Hill set a new mark for the broad jump with a leap of 22 feet 1 1/2 inches. He cleared the high hurdles in 14.9 to shatter a mark of 11 years' standing created by Carl Henry of Belding in 1938, and tied by Bob Schultz of Alma in 1947. And he clipped three-tenths of a second off the low hurdle mark of 23 flat set by Warren Hart of Mt. Morris in 1940.

Dundee Shows Class.

Dundee racked up 40 1/2 points to win the class C diadem as the Pioneers of East Grand Rapids had to be content with second place on its 29 points.

A chap by the name of Jack Goodrich was the thorn in the side of class C contestants. He gave Dundee firsts in the broad jump and both hurdle events. His time of 15 flat in the highs broke the old mark of 15.6 set by Richard Bergman of Charlevoix in 1938.

In reversing the results as com-

pared with last year, Michigan School for the Deaf picked up 45 1/2 points. Bloomfield Hills was in second with 33 1/2, while a surprisingly strong Vestaburg squad came in third with 30 1/2.

Monroe Dial won the high jump for the Deaf school with a leap of 5 feet 10 1/2 inches. The old record was set last year by Richard Miner of Bloomfield Hills at 5 feet 9 1/2 inches. Gaylord Snyder of Vestaburg did the low hurdles in 23.6 to break a mark of 23.8 made last year by Gordon Craig of Bloomfield Hills. Luther took the class D medley relay with a time of 2:42.3 to better the old time of 2:47.2 by the same team last year.

Joe Host of Catholic Central, Grand Rapids, registered a new half-mile mark for the Furniture City lads to shoot at in the future. In winning his 880-yard specialty he clocked the first quarter in 55 and went on to finish in 2:01. Beattie of South held the old city mark of 2:01.3, when he ran the event in the state meet in 1945.

Sets the Pace.

Ralph Lock and Kenny Jones shared honors for the Indians of Ottawa. Kenny bested the highly-heralded Dick Conley of Saginaw in the 440, overtaking the Lumberjack in the last 75 yards, and was ahead by eight yards at the finish. He also ran anchor on the half-mile relay team that won its heat thumbs down, with Lock giving the boys a nice lead to work on. Bob Azkoul and Bob Brown followed in order before Jones took over.

Lock also took second in the broad jump, and his teammate, 14-year-old Dick Jones, a freshman, tied for fourth in the same event.

Ron Kulczak of Catholic annexed a third in the shot for the Cougars. Don Robach of Catholic tied for fourth in the pole vault. Glenn Weaver gave Creston its two points by taking third in his heat of the 880, and Paul Blattner took a fifth in the high hurdles to give Union two points.

East's Medley team of Jon Parrish, Bill Durkee, Alan Pardoe and Tom Payette won their race in 2:38.3. The half-mile relay team also won its race. Karl Newman won his heat in the 440, and David Newman was second in the broad jump. Bert Baker took a sixth in the high hurdles and Jim Chamberlain was sixth in the century.
