place. Grand Rapids East lost its

The Birmingham medley relay time of 2:33.4 broke the old mark of 2:38.2 set by River Rouge a year ago. Ypsilanti's Dave Hill set a new mark for the broad jump with a leap of 22 feet 1% inches. He cleared the high hurdles in 14.9 to shatter a mark of 11, years' standing created by Carl Henry of Belding in 1938, and tied by Bob Schultz of Alma in 1947. And he clipped three-tenths of a second off the low hurdle mark of 23 flat set by Warren Hart of Mt. Morris in 1940.
