mark was :15.6 by Dick Bergam of Charlevoix, set in 1938. In the first preliminary, Jack Goodrich of Dundee won in 15.5. Then Harlin Bergamin of Milan won his preliminary in :15.4, only to see Goodridge come back to win the finals in 15 flat.

Monroe Dall of School for the Deaf set the first Class D record of the day. He high jumped 5 feet 10 $\frac{1}{4}$  inches against the old mark of 5-9 $\frac{1}{2}$  by Dick Miner of Bloomfield Hills in 1948. The next came in the low hurdles as Gaylord Snyder of Vestaberg won in :23.6 against the old record of :23.8 by Gordon Craig of Bloomfield Hills in 1938. The medley relay team of Luther claimed the last record, at 2:42.3. Luther also held the old mark, set in 1948, at 2:47.2.

Balance paid off for the Trojans of Saginaw high, as they won only three first places, in the broad jump and both relays. They failed to score in only three events, the high hurdles, 880 and pole vault.

Eastern scored Lansing's only points in Class A with a fifth place in the medley relay. Running for the Quakers were Jack Sturtevant, Charles Lundberg, Dennis Gilchrist and John Bond. Sexton was disqualified for elbowing in the same event.

Everett made the best showing, with 9 $\frac{1}{2}$  points in Class C. Johnny Kinnans tied for first in the pole vault with Jack Kelly of South Lake at 11 feet 6 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches, and Ed Townsend was sixth in the mile. The Viking medley relay team of Dwight Quinn, Fred Heath, Duane Smith and Bruce Pellet was fourth.

Of the area squads, Charlotte scored eight points in Class B as Ken Sparks was third in the shot put, and fourth in the pole vault and the medley relay team finished fourth. Howell totaled six points in the same class as Doug Stringer was fifth in the low hurdles, George Hasbrouch third in the 880 and Bob McMacken sixth in the shot put.

In Class C Landle scored six and a half points on Ken Vinco's tie for second in the high jump and Clem Tuttle was fifth in the high hurdles.

Joe Hovanesian of Okemos gained the only clear-cut first as he won the Class C shot put with a toss of 45 feet 8 inches.
