Saginaw High Takes State Track Title

East Lansing, May 28—The Lumberjacks of Saginaw High piled up 44 points to win their fifth consecutive class A title in the Lower Peninsula High School Track and Field meet here Saturday afternoon.

Saginaw took firsts in the 880 yard relay, medley relay, broad jump, and one heat of the 440 besides picking up points in six other events. Saginaw Arthur Hill was second with 25 1/4, Kalamazoo third with 23 3/5, Jackson fourth with 18 points and Grand Rapids Ottawa Hills fifth with 17 1/10.

Championships in other classes went to Birmingham in class B, Dundee in class C and Michigan School for the Deaf of Flint in class D.

Nine meet records were shattered by the more than 1,100 athletes from 218 high schools competing at Michigan State College under near perfect track conditions.

en was Saginaw's time of 2:33.7 in the medley relay. The old mark of 2:34.5 was made by Benton Harbor last year. Jim Ellis was the standout for the Lumberjacks as he did the 440 in :50.5, just two seconds off the meet record.

Although Birmingham won the B title with 49 1/3 points, Ypsilanti's Dave Hill was the standout star of the event. Hill set new meet records in winning the low and high hurdles and the broad jump. He also placed in the three way tie for third in the class B high jump.

Largely because of Hill, Ypsilanti placed second with 29 points. Niles was third with 21, Mt. Pleasant fourth with 15 1/2 and Grand Rapids Godwin fifth with 15. Ypsilanti won last year with Birmingham runner-up.

Dundee took the class C title with 40 7/8 points. Jack Goodrich starred for Dundee as he took firsts in both hurdles events and the broad jump. His time :15 in the 120 high hurdles broke the old mark of 15.6 set by Dick Bergman of Charlevoix in 1938.

Thumb District entries in the meet, and their standings, include:

Bud Way, Port Huron, fourth in class A 120-yard high hurdles and sixth in 200-yard low hurdles; Robert Lee, Algonac, fourth in class C 120-yard high hurdles, and Pat Donahue, Marine City, four-way tie for fourth place in class C high jump.

In team scores, Port Huron finished twentieth among 31 class A teams. Algonac was thirteenth and Marine City twenty-sixth in the class C division, which also had 31 entries.
