

Bud Way, Laverne Gorinac And Dave McCue Help Reds To Take Third Spot In Annual Meet

Birmingham Takes 1st Place, Ferndale Runnerup; Tennis Team Defeated; Golf Tournament Here Friday At Black River

Hazel Park, June 2—New Eastern Michigan league track and field records were set here Tuesday, before Birmingham High School received the championship title award.

The Maples won the honors with 88.6 points with Ferndale showing 46.7, Port Huron 43, East Detroit 18.1, Hazel Park 14.6 and Mt. Clemens 10.

Port Huron Reds had the honor of setting four new records. Bud Way won the low and high hurdles in new time while Laverne Gorinac set a new mark in the 440-yard dash and Dave McCue in the half mile.

Lansing, June 2 —AP—With the first fawns of the year being reported, the Conservation Department again warned well-meaning tourists to leave them alone.

Sometimes fawns are found in the woods, and the uninitiated, thinking they are orphaned, take them home. In most cases, the doe is hiding nearby, and the fawn should be left to her care.

Fawn "kidnappers" are subject to prosecution, department officials said.

Commercial fishermen blamed pollution for the continued slump in April walleye production in Saginaw Bay.

Reports to the Conservation Department indicated that production this year totalled 7,269 pounds, a little more than half the 79,879 catch in April, 1948.

These figures compared with 1,303,438 pounds taken in the spring of 1942, last year of the big hauls that made the Bay's walleye fishing famous.

At the same time, the Department reported that late reports put the total 1948 commercial fish produc-
