

Marks Fall At Hastings

Bachman, Kinnane, Milbourne of Eaton Rapids Set New Records

HASTINGS, April 22 (AP) — Niles trackmen repeated as Class B titleholders in the Hastings relays today 49 7/12 points, far out-distancing second-place Walled Lake with 28 1/2.

Kalamazoo St. Augustine won in the combined Class C-D division with 48 7/10 points to replace 1949 champion Milan.

Three new Class B records and two C-D marks highlighted the competition. John Bachman of East Lansing heaved the shot 50 feet 3 1/2 inches to better his own 1949 mark of 47 feet 11 1/2 inches.

In the high jump, John Milbourne of Eaton Rapids leaped 5 feet 10 1/2 inches to break a 1940 record set by Bob Gelsler of Dowagiac.

John Kinnane of Lansing Everett pole vaulted 11 feet 8 inches to pass the old mark of 7 7/8 set by Bob Mohre of Charlotte in 1947. Harlan Benjamin of Milan broke his own 120-yard high hurdle record of 15.7 seconds in Class C-D with a 15.5 time.

The Holt sprint medley team set a record of two minutes 43.5 seconds, bettering Ypellanti Roosevelt's 1948 figure of two minutes 43.9 seconds.

Niles won first places in the 440-yard dash, the two mile relay, and the distance medley relay.
