12 Men And Relay Team Go To State

Maugh Sets Record In Pole Vault And Fowler In Sprint

Ann Arbor High's newly crowned Five-A League track champions tode cast a collective eye at further honors in Saturday's state Class A championships at Michigan State College. Coach Tim Ryan's Pioneers,

Coach Tim Ryan's Pioneers, while walking off with the league and regional team titles in Saturday's combination meet at Wines Field, qualified 12 men and a halfmile relay team for participation in as many events in the state meet.
Ann Arbor missed qualifying in only one event—the medley mile relay—and qualified two men five events, the broad jump, 100 and 220-yard dashes, the mile run and the low hurdles.

Ryan calls the team better than all but one he has taken to the state meet in his 24 seasons as track coach here.

Tallied In Every Event

The Pioneers scored in every event to run up 75 1/5 points and produced two of the three new league records established. Battle Creek was the runner-up with 47 2/5 points while last year's titlist, Jackson, placed third with 41 11/30 points. Trailing were Lansing Sexton, 215/6, and Lansing Eastern,

Battle Creek qualified 10 state meet entrants, Jackson had eight, and the two Lansing schools three

New league marks were set in the shot put, 100-yard dash and pole vault. Additionally, the low hurdles time of 20.5 seconds, set by Ann Arbor's Willie Gavin, becomes an automatic league record since the distance of 180 yards is new this year.

Brake Old Record

Ann Arbor's Roger Maugh cracked one of the league's oldest standards when he won the pole vault with a 12-foot, one-inch leap. The old record of 11 feet, 11% inches was set by Eastern's Ted Wonch back in 1934. The Pioneer's Bob Fowler was clocked at 9.9 seconds for the dash to eclipse the loop's 10.2-second standard held jointly by himself and three others and first set in 1947. Ann Arbor won eight of the meet's 14 events (there were two 440-yard races) and had the meet's only double winners in Fowler, who took both dashes, and Gavin, who won both hurdle races. The Pioncers' George Jayne established himself a solid threat for the state mile title by going the route in four minutes, 38.4 seconds.

The meet marked the seventh loop championship for the Ann Arborites.

YPSILANTI — Dundee's Vikings
were the only 1949 team winners to repeat here Saturday in the regional high school track and field meet at the Michigan State Normal College course.

Saginaw Arthur Hill replaced Saginaw High as team champion in Class A by scoring 70 2/5 points to runner - up Pontiac's 55 2/5. Ecorse ousted Ypsilanti in Class B by a 10-point margin.

Dundee's wining total of 51 points in Class C included 19 scored by Jack Goodridge. Milan finished a distant second to the Vikings with 33 points.

Won Three Events

Goodridge won the low hurdles, broad jump, and high jump, after finishing second to Milan's Harlan Benjamin in the afternoon's openhigh hurdles race. Benjamin upset Goodridge in the tall tim-bers by tying the Dundee 1949 regional record of 14.8 sec-

onds. Goodridge came back an hour later in the lows to whip Benjamin by 10 yards with a blis-

tering :20.3 clocking.

Jerry Leland, Ypsilanti Roosevelt's handy miler, and the Arthur Hill half-mile relay team accounted for the meet's only other record performances. Leland turned in a new Class C mark of 4:37.9 in his specialty, while the Class A Trojans clipped enine-tenths of the second off the 1:34.3 relay record

set last year by Saginaw.

Dundee qualified seven men in eight events for the state finals.

Milan placed three men in six

events and qualified both relay
teams. Roosevelt's Rough Riders prepared three men for Saturday's contest, while Ypsilanti's five qual-ifiers will represent the school in seven events plus a relay.
