## TROJANS PLACE FIFTEEN IN FINALS FOR CITY MEET

Tag Miller Seeks Metro Trojans place

Miller High School Trojans qualified 15 individuals and one relay team for the Metropolitan track finals Tuesday, held at Redford High. Dave Mann, brilliant athlete, although topped in his speciality, the broad-jump, is expected to net at least 15 points for Coach Leroy Dues.

Harold Dye of Southwestern surprised in the semi-finals by jumping 22 feet, 7 inches, as against 22 feet, 4 inches for Mann. However, Mann won the 100 yard dash in 10.2 and finished third in the 220 yard dash.

Northwestern, defending champions of the Metro loop, placed 10 individuals and a relay team in the finals which posed against Miller's 15 and one relay team, giving them a slight chance of repeating their victory of last year.

GREEN FAST

Joe Howard of Northwestern, although the last hurdler to clear the bar in the 120-yard low hurdles, finished first in 13.4 seconds. Charles McIntosh of Miller took the shot put heave with 50 feet, six inches, followed by Walter Wilson of Southeastern with 49 feet, 7% inches.

Les Green of Miller topped a fas field in the 440-yard run with 51.2, while Charles Elzy of the Colts and Bill Barton of Cooley were both under :52.

McIntosh and Dye were surprise winners in the finals, as Wilson and Mann had been premeet favorites. Miller, observers believe, will win heir first Metro crown in five years.
