

# Triple Sparks Ferndale to

## Maples Dethroned in EML

Lincoln Luminary Scores 19¼ Points

Bill Morris made his coach's farewell party a roaring success Wednesday in the sixth annual Eastern Michigan League track and field championships at Hazel Park.

The smooth-striding Morris became a triple winner and sparked Lincoln High, of Ferndale, to its second title in four years. Ferndale rolled up 63 points in dethroning Birmingham which had worn EML laurels for two successive years.

Other team totals were: Port Huron, 44½; Birmingham, 39½; Mt. Clemens, 28; Hazel Park, 14, and East Detroit, 12.

THIS WAS Scott Street's third and final varsity team at Lincoln. Next fall Street is to become principal of a new elementary school.

Morris won both hurdles and the broad jump in addition to anchoring his school's winning relay team for a personal contribution of 19¼ points.

Joel Ross, Birmingham's fine sprinter who is headed for Michigan State, established records in both the 100 and 220-yard dashes despite a slow track softened by early afternoon rains.

Ross won the century in :10.3 and the 220 in :22.50.

Other records were set by James Fisher, of Mt. Clemens, who lofted the shot 49 feet 9¾ inches and by Jack Tyson, of Mt. Clemens, and Jack Hilberry, of Ferndale, who tied for first in the pole vault at 11 feet 1 inch.
