

MSD Cops First Place in Class D At Mt. Pleasant Track Relays

Grand Slam Hit Wins for Michigan

Chicago — AP — Undefeated Michigan continued its drive for the Big Ten baseball pennant Friday by notching its fifth straight conference win—a 6-5 count over Illinois at Champaign.

The two teams wind up their series today. Other two-game sets will end with Ohio State at Indiana, Wisconsin at Purdue and Northwestern at Minnesota for a double-header. The Northwestern-Minnesota contest was rained out Friday.

Ralph Morrison hammered a grand slam home run in the seventh inning to give Michigan its win over the Illini. Pitcher Alby Plain's three-game winning string was broken. He was the losing twirler.

The game was played in a 45-mile-an-hour windstorm.

MSD copped five first places and set two records in taking the D championship.

The MSD quartet of Charles Ramberg, Charles Allen, Ted Corrin and Dick Ewald set a new record in the Central relay. Their time of 1:13.5 clipped five-tenths of a second off the old mark.

The same four boys combined to set a new record in the 440-yard relay. They were clocked in :47.3 to break the old mark of :48.1 set by Mt. Morris St. Mary in 1938. That foursome also took first in the 880-yard relay.

Ewald tied for first in the high jump and the middle distance relay team of Lyle Anderson, Jesse Patrick, Barry Schultz and Harold Allen took the other first place.

The Tartars also took two seconds, five thirds, one fourth and three fifths.

Mt. Morris St. Mary took first place in the distance medley relay and Otisville took first in the shuttles hurdles.
