After staging their finest Central Michigan relay exhibitions in recent years, the Midland Chemics are looking forward to playing host to their first Arrowhead Conference track meet next Saturday.

Last year, the first for this embryonic league, the Chemics walked off with almost every championship title except track. Bay City Handy prevailed in that sport.

The year of 1950 seems to be Midland's. However, because the Chemics have beaten both Alpena and Handy handily in dual meets and those two schools shouldn't combine to cut Midland's total much in triangular competition.

Athletic Director Jim Barclay will be meet manager and has announced that all track preliminaries as well as field event finals will be held Saturday morning with track finals beginning at 2 p. m.

Over at Mt. Pleasant, the Chemics did not capture a first place but had enough general strength to compile 36 3-8 points against a tornado-like wind to take fifth place.

Lee Hartman tossed the shot farthest in his life, 45 feet, 11 and three-quarters inches and it placed him fourth. Leo Clark gained a fifth-place tie in the high jump. Del Copus was third in the broad jump.

Midland did the best during the Saturday morning Central relay when its quartet of Dave Young, Del Copus, Hartman and Larry Badour finished second to Flint Northern. Also in the morning the Central relay team, Paul Pappas, Ted Johnson, Ray Crall and Gerry Surprenant, came home fifth.

Charley Temple, battling sophomore, took third in the mile, beating Handy's Jerry Taylor, who had won the dual mile here last Wednesday. Taylor led Temple 100 yards from the finish when Gerry suddenly staggered and barely got to the finish in fifth place.

Gene Wilson, Dallas Cobb, Gerald Poltorak and Jim Dayton teamed up to place third in the middle distance relay and the 440-yard quartet of Copus, Surprenant, Pappas and Hartman also took third. The same foursome was fourth in the 880-yard relay. Russ Sugar, Ron VanSteenhouse, Archie Hepinstall and Dick Betron were fifth in the mile relay.

Flint Northern won the Central Michigan meet with 82 7-8 points and Arthur Hill tallied 64 1-4 points for second. Flint Central had 40 6-8 points. Ferndale, 38, Midland 36 3-8, Bay City Central 28 3-8, Muskegon 23 3-8, Muskegon Heights 20, Bay City Handy 19 and Port Huron 7.

Shepherd turned in the best performance of the area Class "C" schools. It finished sixth with 23 1-10 points. Hemlock produced 10 points.

Shepherd's Bud Smith won the 100 in 10.7. Ben Barrera of Shepherd hooked up with Jerry Leeland of Ypsilanti Roosevelt in a thrilling mile run duel which Leeland won with a final spurt in 5:05.8.

Smith teamed with Dick Figg, Brad Tripp and Bill Salisbury to earn second place for Shepherd in the Central relay and fifth in the 880-yard relay. Shepherd finished sixth in the shuttle hurdle relay, fifth in the middle distance and two-mile relays.

Hemlock placed fifth in the Central relay and second in the middle distance relay.
