

Algonac's Jim DeBoyer Sets 60-Yard Mark In River Rouge Relays

Ann Arbor, April 16—AP—Two teams of championship caliber dominated the Michigan High School track picture today as a result of the 12th annual River Rouge Relays Saturday.

Saginaw Arthur Hill needed a disqualification in the 880 yard relay to take the Class A team honors from Ann Arbor High.

The Hillites finished with 32½ points to the Pioneers 32 1/3. Ann Arbor lost what might have been its winning points when a runner stepped out of the allowable baton passing zone in the 880.

Class B honors went to Ecorse High School. The suburban Detroit squad chalked up 39½ points to second place Mt. Pleasant's 23. Berrien Springs took honors in the Class C-D division, scoring 20 points to 19 for runner up Ann Arbor University High.

Five meet records fell in the three day events. Jim Arnold of Class A Battle Creek set a new mile mark of 4:41.4.

Ecorse's sprint medley relay team bettered the Class B mark with a 3:54.5.

THREE NEW marks were set in Class C-D.

Gary Cullen, of Ypsilanti Lincoln High jumped 5 feet 10½ inches. Algonac's Jim DeBoyer made a 60 yard dash mark .66 and Hoffmeyer's mile mark completed the show of record smashing.

1,000 athletes from 96 schools competed.

Ann Arbor's Jim Love, was accorded the "outstanding" Class A athlete award. Hurdler Junior Stielstra took the title in Class B. Tom Hoffmeyer of Lansing Events was named in Class C-D for his record bettering 338.4 mile run.

Schemansky, participating in the Michigan Senior Men's AAU weightlifting tournament here Sunday, lifted 402 pounds in the continental and jerk event. He represented Detroit Northern YMCA.

AAU officials said this broke the world mark of 392½ pounds, set last summer at London by John Davis of York, Pa.

The meeting was climaxed with the selection of Victor Seipki, 18, of the Detroit Northeastern YMCA, as "Mr. Michigan of 1951." He was picked from a field of 13 contestants.
