## Ann Arbor University High Sets Class C Pace; Everett Squad Is Third

### Indians End Seven-Year Saginaw Valley Reign; Hoffmeyer Wins Mile; Pearce Leads 'C' Shotputters

The seven-year reign of the Saginaw Valley high school on the state Class A track throne was broken Saturday, but it took a darkhorse Ottawa Hills band of Indians from Grand Rapids, instead of the favored Five-A champions, Ann Arbor, to do it.

Scoring in seven of the 13 events, but leading only two final places, the Class B school competing in Class C scored 27 1/2 points to edge out Saginaw Arthur Hill, which had 24. Ann Arbor was last with 18. Defending champion Flint Northwood scored four with 21 and Sault Ste. Marie with 20 1/2.

A stiller darkhorse walked off with the Class C championship as Ann Arbor university high led all the way to finish with a total of 50 points, eight more than Algonac's 22 in second place. Lansing Everett made it a three-way race by scoring 21 points to finish third, with Ypsilanti Lincoln fourth at 13 and Hamawee fifth at 12. Favored Shepherd fell by the wayside, scoring only seven points for a 10 for 12th place.

The meet, split for the first time, with Classes A and B holding their Michigan State championship track. Ann Arbor was staged on the afternoon final for half an hour, and the muddy track kept running event times up, although the dash men were helped by a strong wind.

Only one record time was beaten, and that was not allowed as the wind was over 15e miles per hour. Jim Winger of Monroe, who finished with high point honors at 12, won the 100-yard low hurdles in 18.8, beating the old mark of 20.4, set last year by Cliff Walker of Kalamazoo.

**Brown Faces Ottawa**

It was Bob Brown who carried Ottawa Hills to the title, with victories in both dashes for 12 points. During the morning preliminaries, he equaled the old mark of 20.8 in the 100 and ran the 200 in 51.8, two-tenths of a second better than the old record. The wind, however, was 11 miles per hour and the marker did not register officially.

Jim Brouder of Croton Point ran the low hurdles in 20.3, one-tenth of a second better than the old record, and Bud Smith of Shephard, M in Class C, ran the 200 in 52.3, again one-tenth of a second better than the old mark. These were chalked up in the preliminaries also, but the wind kept them from being official.

Winger won his high point honor over Brown by adding a sixth in the broad jump to his extra points. Bill Ledford of Grand Rapids University scored 10 with seconds in both dashes.
