

Lakeview Fifth In 'B' Scramble

Spartan Relay Teams Score
Heavily at Ann Arbor.

ANN ARBOR—The Otisville and Cadillac slogged through a rain-swept meet here yesterday to seize state track championships.

Cadillac, with brilliant Dale Stevens leading the way, scored 33 6/7 points to step way out on the class B field and depose defending champion Niles.

Otisville Wins in 'D'
Otisville, with its individual honors centered in Bob Williamson, scored another fat margin over the class D field and scored 45 points to supplant defending champion Benton Harbor St. Johns.

Mr. Pleasant, with 18 1/2 points, was the runner up to the victorious Cadillac team, followed by Ecorse, 17, Ludington, 17, Battle Creek, Lakeview 13 1/2, Niles 13, Roseville and Zeeland 12, and East Grand Rapids 10.

Stevens shared individual honors with junior Stedra, Ludington's outstanding trackster and Kay Keller, Mt. Pleasant pole vaulter who set the only meet record.

Breaks Record
Stedra also turned in a high point performance with victories in the low hurdles and broad jump and a third in the high hurdles. His 20.6 time in the lows equalled the state record.

Keller took his share of the limelight with a vault of 12 feet 2 1/2 inches, to wipeout the 10 year old record set by Dygert of East Lansing by a margin of a bare quarter inch.

Stevens paced the balanced Cadillac team with seconds in the high and low hurdles and a great effort on Cadillac's winning 800 yard relay team.

Run in Rain
The meet was run under the handicap of an intermittent driving rain that sent the spectators scurrying for cover several times and turned the track into mud in spots.

Coach Bolla Anderson's Lakeview squad set a new school record by finishing in fifth spot—highest ever attained by a Spartan team. Lakeview picked up most of its points in the two relay events, taking third in the medley relay and second in the half-mile relay. In addition Ron Hunter came in third in the 100 yard dash and Maurice Bates tied for sixth in the high jump.

Trailing East Grand Rapids in class B were Fenton 9, St. Joseph and River Rouge with 8 1/2, Birmingham and Three Rivers 8, Grand Blanc with 6 1/2, Adrian and Greenville 6, Plymouth Bentley 5, Eaton Rapids, Manistee and Lansing Resurrection with 4, Albion 3 1/2, Big Rapids 3 1/2, Alma 3 1/2, Marshall Forks, Godwin Heights and Traverse City with 3, Allegan 2 1/2, Cass City, Grandville and Plymouth with 2 1/2, Bad Axe, Grand Lodge and Inkster with 2, Howell 1 1/2, Center Line, Farmington, Hastings and Lowell with 1 each, Donagay 6/7, Dearborn, Leary, Romulus and Walled Lake with 1/2.
