

Ottawa Takes Early Lead In Michigan Track Finals

Dick Jones Second in Broad Jump; Hendrickson Takes a Fourth in Shotput

East Lansing—Ottawa Hills High school took a slight lead for state class A track laurels at the noontime lull as Dick Jones of Ottawa Hills came in for a second in the broad jump and Bob Hendrickson placed fourth in the shotput. This gave the Indians eight points.

South High school picked up five points as big Pat Fortune took second in the shotput with a heave of 51 feet 2½ inches, placing behind Driener of Saginaw Arthur Hill who tossed out the iron ball 51 feet 10 inches.

Those were the only finals in class A completed at noon Saturday. Other west Michigan track stars

were holding their own in the big meet at Michigan State college.

One of the class C standouts was Don Chatterson of Wyoming Park. Chatterson clipped off a third place in his high hurdles heat. The winning time was 15.8, set by Brown of Ann Arbor University High.

One of Zeeland's top athletes in history, Bernie Raterink, proved the top man in his 220-yard dash in class B. Bernie legged the distance in 23.3, taking a first easily. Bert Zagers, top Cadillac dashman, won his heat with a 23.1 mark, tying Jim VanCleve of Fenton.

Max Matson of Newaygo took a third in the class D 220-yard event. Ted Corrin of Michigan School for the Deaf won in 23.5.

Brown of Plainwell took a second in the class C 220-yard dash.
