

Central Sets 2 Chip Relay Marks

MT. PLEASANT — While Saginaw Arthur Hill won the Central Michigan Relay's Class A championship here yesterday, downing its city rival, Saginaw, 83 3/5 to 78 3/5, Bay City Central Coach Ken Loop and Bay City Handy Mentor Wes Dunn weren't exactly down in the dumps.

The Wolves' Bob Schermerhorn set a new meet record of :15.3 in the 120-yard high hurdles and the distance medley relay squad also chalked up a new mark of 11:32.

Thomas Paces State to Win

EAST LANSING — (U.P.) — Michigan State's track squad swept past Ohio State yesterday, 74 to 58, by taking two of the last three events.

The Spartans trilled the Buckeyes by four points, then took first, second and third in the two-mile run and the 220-yard low hurdles to take the lead. The Buckeyes won the last event, the one-mile relay, but couldn't erase the Michigan State lead.

In addition, Central tied for fifth in the shotput when Jarv Walz hit 46'1" behind the winner, L. Bernard of Flint Central, who reached 51', ran second in the pole vault when an awed Tom Mayville lofted over 11' 3" (he has done 11' 9" against Saginaw) to finish behind Arthur Hill's Bob Dust's 11' 6" mark; took fourth in the middle distance relay, and fifth in the shuttle hurdles.

Handy wound up with Norm Joseph finishing a creditable second in the 100-yard dash behind Bob Mayer of Saginaw with :10.45; second behind Flint Northern in the middle distance relay with 6:36.5 (Central was disqualified in this one after finishing third); fifth in the middle distance relay and fourth in the mile relay.

Behind Arthur Hill and Saginaw were Flint Northern, Flint Central, Bay City Central, Handy, Muskegon, Muskegon Heights, Midland and Lansing Eastern.

While Schermerhorn's new record in the 120-high was impressive because it broke a mark standing since 1940, it was the performance of the distance medley relay team that was outstanding.

Central's squad, after Whitbrodt, Arenson and Lloyd had run the

440, half mile and 880, respectively, were trailing by about 40 yards when tow-headed Bob Hoffman took the baton for the mile stint. How that kid ate up the yards not even Coach Loop can figure. But eat 'em up he did, and he wound up at the head of the pack at the finish.

Shepherd High nosed out Charlevoix, 59-58, for the Class C title, and Friday Ecourse won the Class B and Norman-Dickson of Brethern took the Class D championship.
