# Tars, Colts Harrier Champs

Denby High, which is in the process of losing its East Side football title, already has replaced it with the sectional cross country championship.

Led by Charley McLaughlin and Maurice Faieler, the Tars ended Cass Tech's four-year reign Wednesday as the City League settled its divisional fights over a wind-swept Palmer Park course.

McLaughlin and Faieler romped home 1-2 to boost the Tars to an easy victory over five rivals. McLaughlin was the winner in 10:17.4.

WITH THE smooth-striding pair leading the way, Denby claimed the title with an unusually high 66 points. The Tars got none of their other runners in the first 10.

Northeastern was a distant runnerup with 88 points. Northern followed with 97, Eastern with 105; Cass, defending champions, with 117, and Southeastern with 191.

On the West Side, Northwestern claimed the sectional crown for the sixth straight year, but only after a tight battle with Redford. The Colts won it, 41 to 43, by jamming their five runners into the top 14 positions.

REDFORD'S Al Manser was the individual winner in a fine 10:04.8. But he was chased in by Northwestern's Burle Huggins, the runnerup; Leon McKissic, fourth; Claude Fox, ninth; Bob Backus, 12th and Armsby Hall, 14th.

Aside from Manser, Redford got only Ken Santer and

Gordon Rogers into the top 10 positions. Santer and Rogers were seventh and eighth.

Cooley, which had reigned for five years before Northwestern began its long title streak, was a close third with 53 points, mainly on the strength of Ron Acton's third-place finish.

Denby and Northwestern will be co-favorites for the league title race next week.

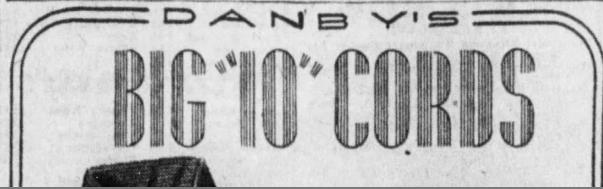
