Cooley's Acton Posts Season's Best Time

Ron Acton, smooth-striding cross-country ace from Cooley High, reeled off the best time of the City League season Wednesday as he led the Cardinals to an easy 18-41 triumph over Mackenzie.

Acton, ninth in the 1951 City finals, covered the two-mile layout in 10:04, only 1.6 seconds over the title-winning time of a year ago.

Cooley jammed its top five entries into the 1-2-3-5-7 spots to claim the victory.

NONE OF THE other individual race winners approached Acton's effort. The closest was a 10:26, turned in by Ernie Tomos, who paced Miller to a 24-39 victory over Southeastern.

Denby's Chuck McLaughlin checked in at 10:33, but the Tars still bowed to Cass Tech, 27 to 32. Pershing's Bob Williams was a winner for the fourth straight week, coming in at 10:41 while the Doughboys whipped Eastern, 19 to 42.

Northwestern grabbed the first five places, with Burle Huggins home first in 10:41, to score a perfect 15-45 victory over Central.

Ken Santer's 10:49 led Redford to a 17-40 edge over St. Joseph, and Alex Marshall's 11:03 sparked Northeastern to a 27-30 victory over Northern.
