

County Girls Compete Today For Track Titles

Kearsley and Mandeville girls' track teams will attempt to defend their Genesee County Girls' League cinder titles today with a four-girl nucleus of last year's championship squads.

The annual female run is scheduled at Dort Field, with the first event slated for 2:30 P. M. and the last at 4:30.

Kearsley won the Class B title in 1951 by a one-sided margin. Top point-getter was the versatile Mickey Lovett. She was the only double winner last year and will not be back this season.

The main force of the Hornets team this season will be the veteran foursome of Shirley Young, Joyce Radke, Mary Ellen Goulish and Shirley Rutledge. They will carry the championship flag against leading contenders, Flushing, Beecher and Bendle.

In the Class C ranks, the Mandeville girls will be placed by Doris Sincock, Bonny Beal, Sandy DeCarte and Ilene Johnson. Last year's star, Mary Donohue, is graduated and will not compete.
