# Hornets Cop **Second Title**

Flushing, Goodrich Take Runnerup Spots

Competing with practically the same squad as last year, the Kearsley High girls track team again showed the Genesee County Class B League too much power and depth as the female Hornets strode to their second straight cinder title.

The defending champions outscored their nearest rivals, Flushing, by more than a two-to-one ratio. Kearsley copped the honors with 501/2 points, with the runners-up getting only 24.

While the Class B winners were having an easy time, Otisville surprised everyone by taking the Class C laurels in a tight squeeze. The first-place squad accumulated 365/6 points, nipping Goodrich with 285/6.

Kearsley missed only Mickey Lovett, star female athlete of 1951, but Shirley Young and Joyce Radke performed well enough to win the Class B meet in a breeze.

Miss Young gained first places in the 75-yard dash and the standing broad jump and led off the winning Kearsley relay team. She was the only double winner of the day. Miss Radke copped top laurels in the hop, step and jump event and took a second in the 75-yard dash, and anchored the relay squad.
