

Beuerle Runs 100 in :10.2

Saginaw high school held its
with state Class A track champion-
ship in eight years today but the
top individual performer in the
annual meet held Saturday at East
Lansing and Ann Arbor was Ray
Eggenston. Edie Jackson's great
wardward stride.

Eggenston strided and leaped
to four-foot paces, being a second
and in 1951, as he single-handedly
brought Edie Jackson into a tie for
the Class C championship with
Ann Arbor University high.

He won the 100-yard high hur-
dles, the 100-yard low hurdles, the
broad jump and the high jump to
score all of his team's 24 points.
Rowville, led by Roy Zimmer-
man, claimed the Class B title
while little Norman Dickson of
Brethren took top honors in Class
D.

Dickson removed most chances for
new state records, but Don Beuerle
of Suttons Bay managed to eclipse
the 100-yard dash record in Class
D before the steady drizzle started
Beuerle opened the 100 in 11.2
seconds in the morning prelimi-
naries to clip records of a second
off the old mark established in
1945. He covered the same distance
in a much slower 11.1 seconds to
win the title in the final.

Saginaw's balance paid off in
Class A and the Trojans were
kings again. They won the title
five straight years since in 1942
before Flint Northern ended their
reign 10-0 last year.

Bob Fildner gave Saginaw its
only shot. The Bruins middle
distance runner won the 800-yard
race in 2:04.7 minutes.

The Trojans piled up a total of
21 points. Possible to a second with
19 points followed by Highland
Park, 10-1; Kalamazoo 13; Grand
Rapids 1, 10-1; and Cross
Pointe, 17.

Zimmerman was a double-winner
for Rowville, grabbing the broad
jump with a 26-foot, 4 1/2-inch leap
and the 200-yard dash in 23.8 sec-
onds. He also ran a leg on Rose-
ville's winning 500-yard relay team.

Rowville scored on 35 points,
more than double the 16-point total
mustered by runner-up Grand
Rapids. Birmingham, Marshall and
Suttons Bay led with 14 points
and Alma and Pisten deslocked
for sixth with 12 points.

Eggenston won the high hurdles
in 1:0.8 seconds, the low hurdles in
21.2 seconds, jumped 21 feet, 7 1/2
inches in the broad jump and
cleared 5 feet, 10 inches in the
high jump.

Jerry Wolf and Howard Young
gave Ann Arbor University high
marks in the 200-yard dash and
the pole vault, respectively, to en-
able their school to share with
Saginaw the title it won origi-
nally in 1942. Whitehall was third
with 20 points and Lansing 17
with 15 1/2 points.

Brethren made the Class D race
a minor with two legs, a sec-
ond and five thirds, helping boost
the school's point total to 41.2.
Dick Evans won the 100-yard high
hurdles for Brethren and teammate
Don Stroup took the high jump.

Midwintery was second with
19.2.5 points, followed by Detroit
University School and Suttons Bay
with 12.5.5 points each. Detroit
14.2.5, Marquette School on the
Dart, 12.4.5, and Hazel City, 12.2.5.

Grand Traverse regional athletes
figured in the scoring in the ex-
tra track meets Sunday, adding
points in Class B, C and D.
15 Jack Oberholzer, who has
retired for Coach Dean Wilson's Trav-
erses Trojans this spring, gave the
Hawk and Gold its sole point in
