

# 'A' Honors To Saginaw

## Favorite Cops Title in Rain At Ann Arbor; Vault Decides Issue

ANN ARBOR, May 24 (AP)—Favored Saginaw, despite two tough breaks, won the Class A championship in the annual lower peninsula track and field meet here today with a total of only 21 points.

The Saginaw delegation ousted defending titlists Grand Rapids Otsewa Hills with the amazing low point total in a meet that finished with six teams within four points of the winners.

Going into the last event, the pole vault, Saginaw had 19½ points, Pontiac 19, Highland Park 18½, Kalamazoo Central 18, Grand Rapids Union 17½, and Grosse Pointe 17.

Saginaw's Trojans picked up 1½ points in the vault while none of the close pursuers placed.

Jack Summers turned in the best individual performance for the Vikings by placing second to Eggleston in the broad jump. Art Smith placed sixth in the high hurdles and fifth in the lows.
